#### *To Be or... Maybe You Better Be!*

I'm going to talk about our lives as Christians and how I see



things. I'm going to bring up a couple of people from the Bible to make a point. The first one is the disciple Thomas who, for a period of time, truly doubted Jesus. Even though he had walked with Him, he still wanted tangible proof of Jesus' resurrection, and that He was the Messiah. But with Jesus' help, Doubting Thomas finally believed Him to be His Lord and his God. So, as Christians we like to use Doubting Thomas as one of the apostles that we relate to because we

have doubts – we kind of feel okay then, we're not perfect either.

Next, let's consider Peter. Peter is the guy we all love to think about because we feel we're like him – we think that we're always being a wise-mouth with Jesus, and no matter how hard we try, we're probably never right – we're always making mistakes like Peter did. So we feel okay and comfortable - again because we're fitting into the category of another one of the apostles. But I would like to bring to your remembrance that both of these men were not filled with the Holy Spirit at the time of their doubting and of Peter's being wise-mouthed with Jesus (that's my way of putting it). After they were filled with the Spirit, they became powerful and wonderful and very useful to God.

I have asked people at some of the meetings that I teach to give me some things that the Holy Spirit and the blood of Christ have done for us and they came up with two or three of them and those are the ones commonly known, but I want to give you at least ten or twelve that I came up with.

The Holy Spirit: Teaches - John 10:26. Draws in believers - John 14:12. Gives counsel and testifies about Jesus - John 15:26. Convicts us of sin - John 16:8-9. Guides us into all truth; hears and speaks and shows us all things - John 16:13. Inspired all scripture - Timothy 1:16 & 1st Peter 1:21. Speaks to people - Acts 8:28. Calls us to ministry - Acts 13:2. Sends forth His servants - Acts 13:4. Forbids certain actions - Acts 16:7-8. Acts as an intercessor - Romans 8:26-27. Gives Spiritual gifts – 1st Corinthians 12:4-11.

The blood of Christ: Healing - 1st Peter 2:24. Eternal life - John 6:54. He purchased us - Acts 20:28. Faith and righteousness - Romans 3:24. Justified from the wrath of God - Romans 8:9. A cup of blessings - 1st Corinthians 10:16. Forgiveness of sins - Ephesians 1:7. Reconciled to God - Ephesians 2:13. Peace - Colossians 1:4. Boldness to talk to God - Hebrews 10:19. Fellowship - 1st John 1:7. Overcame Satan - Revelation 12:11.

From years of dealing with people and from my own lack of follow-through at times, I believe that most of you won't bother to look up the above scriptures – you'll just say, "Well, Tony said it, so it must be true." We need to be aware that it may not necessarily be true just because, 'so and so' said it. But, I would ask you to remind yourself though these scriptures of just how powerful God is.

When I said, "To be or better be," we need to make sure we are in God's hands at the time of the rapture because at that time if we're not in His hands, (you can call it whatever you want - I call it not being born-again), you will not go to heaven. I repeat: if you're not in His hands when the rapture comes or when you die, you will not go to heaven. And believe me, if we don't go to heaven, we all know we're going to be in deep trouble for eternity.

So I wrote this to ask you to walk closer with God – get more involved in your personal time with Him, and I'm not just referring to reading and praying, I'm talking about talking to God. He loves to hear from us just as we love to hear from our kids.

# My Testimony

Back in 2002, I was working nights operating a concrete batch plant building at a dam for Olivinhiem reservoir south of Escondido. Because the job consisted of operating a computer for nearly the entire shift I began to go walking and lifting weights to get some exercise. After a period of time my left forearm began to grow in size, but the right arm did not change. My MD sent me for a sonogram. The Tech and two doctors looked at the results and declared that the growth was muscle. The arm continued to grow for several more years.

About two years ago my cardiologist sent me to an endocrinologist who then sent me for a CAT scan and to a surgeon. The CAT scan was inconclusive as it did not show soft tissue very well. The surgeon wanted an MRI. Well, I have a pacemaker, and folks that have pacemakers cannot have an MRI.

A little more than two years ago I had requested prayer at the men's Thursday night bible study because my heart was beating less and less on it's own and the pacemaker was picking up more and more of the beats. I don't remember the exact numbers, but the pacemaker was picking up about 60% of the beats of the upper chamber of my heart and about 95% of the lower chamber. Basically, without the pacemaker, I was a dead man. **I was totally dependent on my pacemaker. BUT GOD STILL ANSWERS PRAYER!!!** You see, my cardiologist knew of a study at St Joseph's hospital in Burbank in which they were doing MRI's on people with pacemakers who are NOT pacemaker dependent, so, **I was tested again and found to BE NOT PACEMAKER DEPENDENT!!!**

Now I was able to enter the study and have an MRI. My arm was found to have a large fatty tumor, but there was a spot in the center that they didn't know what it was. If there was cancer it meant radiation and chemotherapy or at worst, amputation. **BUT GOD!!!** I had surgery 4-19-10 and the biopsy showed that the spot in the center of the tumor was where it was trying to die!!

I thank God and my Christian family, of which the Thursday night men's group is a part, that prayed for me throughout this entire ordeal. To those of you praying for others, **DON'T GIVE UP!**

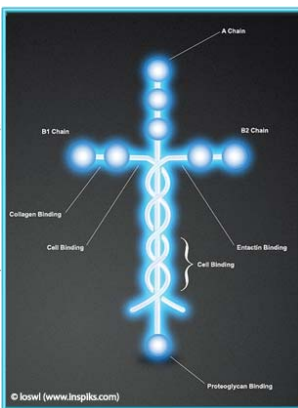
